

MAP DESCRIPTION

For the longest time the villages in the valleys below have been threatened by the regular spring flood when a hard winters worth of snow starts to thaw. Thus a number of small valley like this one have been dammed up, to accumulate most of the melt water and release it at a more sedate pace after spring. The dam itself has been built from heavy stone blocks and it is crowned by a simple tarred road. Tunnels through the rock at both ends connect it to civilization and other small dams like it.





ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTION

This map is divided into eighteen segments to fit the letter format of the document and allow for easy printing. You can find all the individual sections of the map on the following pages. They are ordered from A1 to C6. Print those pages, cut out the individual map segments and assemble them as shown in the following illustration and connect them using either glue or tape.

When cutting remember: The individual segments on the following pages do not overlap!

You will have to allow for some overlap yourself. E.g.: leave some whitespace on one or two sides of most map segments.
