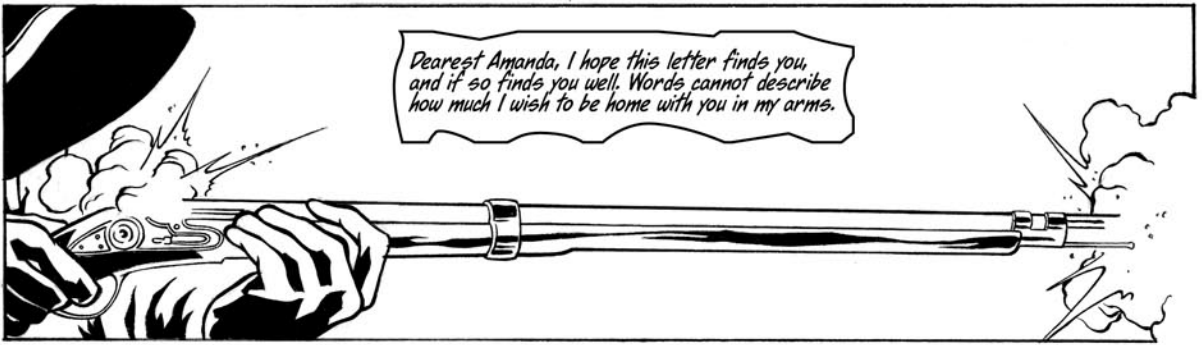

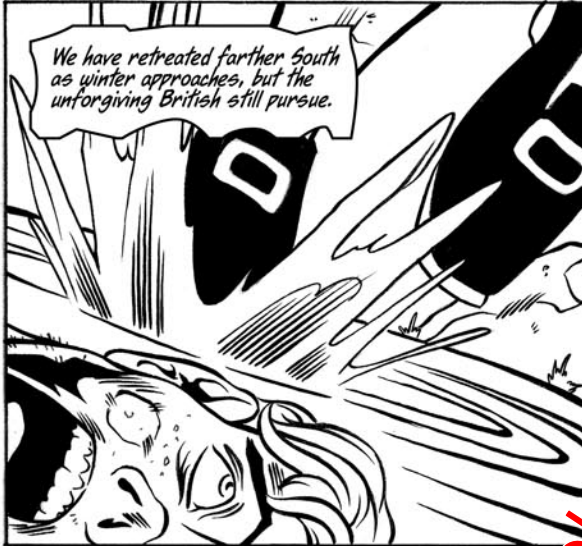

We have retreated farther South as winter approaches, but the unforgiving British still pursue.

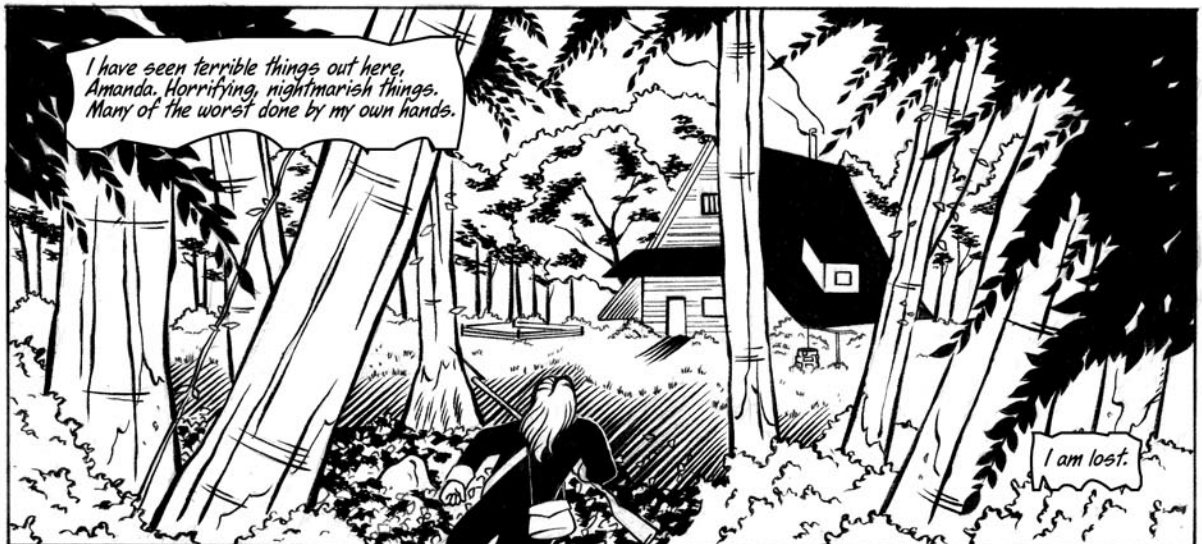


They have taken many of us, the conditions even more so. Our many have been whittled to few, and those few have been scattered.
